**COMMUNITY POLICY AND MANAGEMENT TEAM**

**Team Meeting Minutes**

**May 28, 2026**

**I. Call to Order**

Ms. Regina Barger, CPMT Chair and Pittsylvania County Department of Social Services Director called the meeting to order at 2:06 PM

**II. Roll Call:**

**III. Public Comment:**

No Public Comment.

**IV. Approval of Agenda:**

Ms. Barger asked if anyone had any additions or corrections to the agenda. Ms. Van Der Hyde made a motion for the agenda to be approved, and Ms. Waller seconded the motion. Motion passed.

**V. Consent Agenda:**

Ms. Tosh made a motion to approve April 2026 Minutes and the April 2026 Pool Report. The motion was seconded by Ms. Waller. Motion passed.

**VI. New Business:**

- A. Agency Updates-** DPCS; let the team know that Ms. Rose was no longer with DPCS and would be the new CSA Coordinator for Danville City. DSS; Ms. Malott let the team know that they were fully staffed in the foster care department.
- B. CPMT Chair Presentation –** Ms. Johnson stated that the nomination committee had nominated Ms. Barger as CPMT Chair and Dr. Haymore as Vice Chair for FY27. CPMT will vote on this nomination at the June CPMT meeting.
- C. Behavioral Health Services Redesign Implementation Date Change –** Ms. Johnson updated the team that DMAS has postponed the implementation until December of 2026.
- D. CSA Today -** Ms. Johnson reported the quarterly CSA update distributed by OCS. The team reviewed several ongoing state-level items and discussed their impact on local operations.

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An update was provided regarding the trafficking prevention designation and anticipated reimbursement changes. While implementation is expected to begin in June, official confirmation from the state has not yet been received. The committee was informed that all children currently served are placed in approved placements, with no compliance concerns or anticipated placement disruptions at this time. It was noted that providers appear to have successfully met the required approval deadlines. Additional clarification was shared regarding placements at Grafton. Due to the program operating under a different licensure structure associated with EPSDT services, those placements are not subject to the same guidelines as other group home settings. The CPMT also discussed ongoing delays in receiving updated state rates for the upcoming fiscal year. Because the new rates have not yet been finalized by the state, FY2026 information is not yet reflected on board sheets, and purchase orders for the new fiscal year cannot be completed at this time.

**VII. Old Business**

- A. Psychological Evaluations-** The CPMT received an update regarding discussions held during the May judges' meeting related to the release of psychological evaluations to parents. Concerns had been raised regarding whether parents should have access to evaluations in certain cases, particularly those involving domestic violence or other sensitive family circumstances. The group discussed balancing parental access to information with the potential safety concerns related to disclosures made by children during evaluations. The consensus reached was that if a judge specifically orders that a psychological evaluation not be released, that order will be followed. In situations where no such order exists, the decision regarding release of the evaluation will remain with the agency and the funding source, including CSA, based on the circumstances of the case. It was noted that in many situations, providing parents with the evaluation may be beneficial and support the child's treatment and family understanding. However, concerns remain in select cases where disclosure of information could potentially result in negative consequences within the home environment.

**Closed Meeting:**

Ms. Barger asked for a motion to go into the closed meeting.

Ms. Waller - I move that this meeting of the Pittsylvania County Community Policy and Management Team be recessed and that the Board immediately reconvene in closed meeting for the following purpose: Discussion or consideration of medical and mental health records as permitted by Subsection (A) (15) of Section 2.2-3711 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended and more specifically to consider the treatment and rehabilitation provided to children under the jurisdiction of the Pittsylvania County Community Policy and Management Team. Motion was seconded by Ms. Tosh, followed by a voice vote: Ms. Waller, yes; Ms. Barger, yes; Ms. Malott, yes; Ms. Van Der Hyde, yes; Ms. Moore, yes; Ms. Tosh, yes. Motion passed.

**Return to Open Meeting:**
